This webinar, held 25th January 2024, was led by Andy McCullough. Andy lives in Reading in UK. He has previously lived in Cyprus and ministered in the Middle East. Andy expounded on his famed advocating for humility by missionaries. Even the fact that he was advocating for humility, seemed to

say something – when it seems obvious that missionaries ought to be 'humble'! Andy drew on Matthew 12:43-44 to emphasise three things: 1. When we 'leave home' to go on mission, we will be spiritually challenged. 2. Being humble must be a deeply personal exercise. 3. Demons come back: Not concentrating on our task, can soon have us back to playing host to demons.

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SOAS lecture: Researching Africa in Light of the 'Religions' of Antiracism and Christianity

Jim presented a lecture at Centre for World Christianity of SOAS (School of Oriental and African Studies) at the University of London, on 18th October 2023. A technical failure in university equipment has prevented SOAS from posting a record of the lecture on their website. Fortunately Jim made his own audio recording, which you can listen to through the above link. Here is the abstract to the paper on which this talk was based, that is awaiting peer review for publication: "Considering contemporary anti-racism in the West as a kind of 'religion', Jim's presentation will show how belief in this religion of anti-racism is being taken advantage of to undergird and perpetuate Western domination. A pretence at global homogeneity is used to conceal what the Gospel has brought to Europe, and could bring to others. The White European uses anti-racism to validate his position as the new god, i.e., the global norm to be aspired to, communicated through English, as if English is neutral. Putting aside a supposed need for generosity, that has become control, some Westerners need to get to African grassroots. They are to inform the West using English, while African scholars of the West tell their fellows about Europe using African tongues. This is to uplift the work of the Gospel, and the freedom brought by faith in Christ."

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Socially constructed meanings of *Impucuko* in a comparative historical analysis

This Master's Thesis by Zimingonaphakade Sigenu (University of Cape Town) points out the need to consider indigenous meaning making ('endogeneity') and concepts in development and research. She analyses the changing understanding of *'impucuko'* from her native isiXhosa (commonly translated as 'development' or 'civilisation') over the course of 100 years. Fascinating connections are established with tradition and modernity, the changing political landscape of South Africa, Christianity and its bearing on traditional rituals and customs as well as a broader sociolinguistic African context. Sigenu concludes: "centring the experiences and languages of the previously neglected can offer innovative ways to develop contextually relevant concepts and critical conceptual tools, which can contribute to African theory making and challenge the hegemony assumed by western scholarship and the English language" (Sigenu, p. 74)
