In his latest note he says that there are three now studying the Bible and praying, adding that the authorities took away his *Renacimiento* and make it difficult for them to read the Scriptures. As he does not attend the Mass, they keep him shut up in the cell each Sunday until 11 a.m. However, he says that this has been good for him as he has been able to give the time to prayer.

Some of us have to pass this prison daily and, as we do so, we lift up our hearts to the Throne of Grace for this little inaccessible group, this tiny incipient congregation, which was started, and is being ministered to, by the printed page. We rejoice to think of what the Lord has wrought, in spite of a closed door to workers without and hindrances to believers within.

The printed messenger is a very active and powerful worker. We may well pray the Lord of the harvest that he would send forth labourers such as these into places hitherto and otherwise unreachable. It is true that the Scriptures and tracts require human distribution, but, as seeds are often carried by strange agencies, even so may books and leaflets be carried. Certain sections of most communities are hungry for something to read. Let us see to it that there is no shortage in the supply of that which exalts Jesus Christ and points men to Him.
